A FRESH START: ONE WOMAN'S JOURNEY TO SAFETY AND STABILITY

Shared by the Wuu-rii Banma-li Team

One of our recent clients was referred to the Wuu-rii Banma-li (WBL) team by NPA after receiving support for domestic and family violence and assistance with court matters. At the time, she was staying with her two young children but was facing homelessness as the home environment was no longer suitable.

With safety and stability in mind, she made the courageous decision to seek a place of her own.

Our team supported her in applying for the Start Safely program, which will subsidise her rent for the next 18 months. We also helped her access Victims Services brokerage to secure counselling support for her children and financial assistance to help establish her new home.

She later applied for emergency accommodation through Link2Home and was approved to stay in a temporary unit at GGAC. Throughout this period, she remained highly motivated—submitting multiple housing applications to local real estate agencies.

Her persistence paid off when she secured a private rental unit close to town. We assisted with a rent bond loan and two weeks rent in advance, and GGAC helped move her belongings into the new property.

She is now thriving, regaining her confidence, and feeling proud of her achievements. She regularly visits the Hub with her children, joining in on Friday cook-ups and games of Kahoot.

We're proud to have supported her journey toward safety, independence, and healing.

We are looking for motivated, community-minded individuals who are practical, respectful, and passionate about supporting Aboriginal people and families. Formal qualifications are not essential—what matters most is your ability to build strong relationships, show initiative, and deliver meaningful, hands-on support.

The ideal candidates will:

- ✓ Understand the barriers and challenges faced by individuals and families
- ✓ Have a basic understanding of local services and support systems
- ✓ Be confident working alongside other organisations to improve outcomes for clients.
- ✓ Actively build networks and partnerships that create better opportunities for families
- ✓ Build trust and form strong, respectful relationships with the people they support
- ✓ Provide practical, responsive, and culturally safe assistance
- ✓ Be able to work independently, take initiative, and fulfil the duties of the role without requiring step-by-step direction
- ✓ Be confident with basic technology—email, case notes, and using a computer
- ✓ Be willing and able to travel between Gunnedah and Narrabri as part of the role

In this role, you will provide intensive, long-term support to Aboriginal individuals and families involved in the justice system.

You will work closely with each family for up to 12 months, helping them navigate challenges and take steps toward a stronger, safer future.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are strongly encouraged to apply.

EAPA helps people finding it hard to pay their electricity and/or gas bill because of short-term financial hardship, a crisis or emergency, such as:



loss of income



unexpected essential costs



natural disaster



received a disconnection notice

You may be eligible if all the following apply:

- ✓ you live in NSW
- you have an electricity or natural gas account for your home
- the bill is in your name
- you have not paid your most recent bill
- ✓ the bill you need help with is for an account that is still open
- you're experiencing a short-term financial hardship, crisis or emergency.
