Our very own Tracy and Cherrie proudly represented Gunida Gunyah at the 2025 Armidale Conference: Young People Doing It Tough from June 17–19!

This powerful event brought together leaders, advocates, and frontline workers from across NSW to explore ways we can better support our young people— especially those navigating homelessness, trauma, out-of-home care, detention, and complex life challenges.

Tracy and Cherrie attended inspiring sessions on:

- Rights-based and strengths-based service delivery
- Culturally safe programming
- Supporting young people in detention and care
- Creative tools like arts and storytelling in youth work
- Trauma-informed practice and community-led solutions

They also had the opportunity to connect with deadly speakers like Sharlene McKenzie OAM, Dr Lukas Carey, and Lisa Waters—all passionate leaders making a real difference for young people across the country.

We're so proud of our team for continuing to learn, grow, and bring new knowledge back to strengthen the programs we deliver here at GGAC. Big thanks to the Women's Shelter Armidale for hosting such a meaningful and empowering event



A WORD OR TWO FROM OUR LILLY PILLY PLACE REFUGE MANAGER LISA SMITH:

Just wanted to share a quick recap of the amazing experience Cherrie and I had earlier this week at the 2025 ACHIA Aboriginal Controlled Women and Children Refuge Summit in Port Macquarie (Mon 23 & Tues 24 June).

This was such a deadly space to connect with other workers in our sector and hear about all the incredible things happening in the Core and Cluster refuge space. The future looks bright and strong!

We were surrounded by powerful, compassionate, and knowledgeable Aboriginal women—many who shared their stories, work, and wisdom. It was inspiring and uplifting.

A real highlight for me was meeting Ashlee Donohue, a lived experience advocate and the former CEO of Mudgin-Gal Aboriginal Women's Centre. She shared powerful readings from her book 'Because I Love Him', which hit home for many of us in the room. Cherrie and I were lucky enough to have our books signed—and we even had one personally addressed to the Women of Lilly Pilly Place to keep on our bookshelf.

We've now got a strong network of support and connection with other Core and Cluster refuges across the state, and there's talk of setting up a Communities of Practice forum, which would be an incredible space for ongoing learning and collaboration.

Massive thanks to ACHIA NSW and Gunida Gunyah Aboriginal Corporation for making it possible for us to attend. We're coming back full of ideas, hope, and strength to continue walking alongside our women and children.
